RE: In the Matter of the Provision of Basic Generation Service ("BGS") and Tariff Sheets Reflecting Proposed Revisions to Reliability Must-Run Charge BPU Docket No. ER17070719

Dear Ms. Peterson:

In an Order dated August 23, 2017 in the above-referenced matter (the "August 23 Order"), the Board of Public Utilities (the "Board") approved the joint filing by Atlantic City Electric Company and Jersey Central Power & Light Company (collectively, the "EDCs") pursuant to Section 15.9 of the BGS Supplier Master Agreements. As you will recall, this matter involved changes to the PJM Open Access Transmission Tariff related to costs the BGS suppliers will be assessed by PJM pursuant to the Reliability Must Run ("RMR") charges approved by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") in an Order dated April 26, 2017 in Docket No. ER17-1083-001 ("April 2017 RMR Order").

More specifically, in the August 23 Order, the Board approved the changes to the BGS-RSCP and BGS-CIEP rates requested by the EDCs for the RMR charges resulting from the FERC-approved changes resulting from the April 2017 RMR Order effective as of September 1, 2017. While the Board authorized the EDCs to collect from BGS customers the change in rates associated with the April 2017 RMR Order, it also directed the EDCs to track such collections until receipt of a Final FERC order.

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The purpose of this letter is to inform you that FERC issued such a final order in Docket No. ER17-1083-000 *et al.* on March 5, 2018. The time period to file a rehearing request with FERC has now expired, and no party has requested rehearing. Accordingly, the FERC order at issue is now final, and the EDCs will proceed to reimburse the applicable BGS suppliers pursuant to the terms of the BGS Supplier Master Agreements.
